

**Thirty Years Going!** 

Watkins June 2023 Update

This month marks thirty years since we moved to L'viv, Ukraine, as missionaries. I took my first trip to Moscow during the final years of the Soviet Union in 1989 to study advanced Russian, and I went on scouting trips to Russia or Ukraine every year until our move in 1993. After Moscow, Tom Jackson and I trekked from Berlin to L'viv with suitcases bursting at the seams with Bibles. The next trip was with Myra to L'viv and then Moscow by train to scout out a potential church plant during a bitterly cold winter.

All roads eventually led to L'viv because we had made friends there on previous trips. My final scouting trip to L'viv before our move was with Jeff Bullock. I mention my friends because we all went on to plant elsewhere. Tom planted in Scotland, and Jeff planted in Poland. Fast-forward thirty years, and we are planting in Prague.

Our main friend and team member in L'viv was Hennady Kovalchuk, who came from a rich heritage of pastors, some of whom had been imprisoned for the gospel. Our first team members from the US were Susan (Ward) Ridenour, Mike Little, and Mike Cook. From June to August 1993, we learned to assimilate, find food during the post-Soviet economic collapse, make many Ukrainian friends, survive sickness, wash diapers by hand (Mike), and try to find a crib for Abigail so she didn't have to sleep in our suitcase.

Next came our first large-scale outreach with a team from the US led by Jeff Bullock. We preached on the streets to the point of stopping traffic and had follow-up meetings in the former Museum of religion and atheism, a Dominican Church before Communism. We saw over 400 come to faith on the street, and thirty stayed with us to form the church. Through good times, persecution, and war, Christ Fellowship Church in L'viv remains a thriving church.

This was the beginning of it all, the "ready-shoot-aim" that landed us in Ukraine. It was an exciting time, and we will feature stories from the early days in our following updates. And we are still GOING!

Fast-forward to now; Myra and I just returned to the US from three very busy months in Prague, where we are planting a new church. Our main reason for returning is that we must

complete our Czech visa applications at the embassy in Chicago. Additionally, I will serve at our church planter's assessment center in July, and I have a seminary intensive at Asbury in August. The highlight of the summer will be Abigail and Josh's wedding in September. If all goes as planned, we will return to Prague in early October.
