

## Arrived! - January 2024 Update

After several months of visa processing, packing, and shipping, we are finally in Prague! We found a nice apartment in time to host our family for Christmas, and we are very thankful for God's provision. It will take a few more weeks for the dust to settle, but there is work to be done, and the work has begun. You may remember that we are building upon the outreach group that our friends started here a few years ago, and this has allowed us to start ministry more quickly than expected. Three Czechs came to our church Christmas party, and two came to our home for dinner. Now they want to invite us over, which is a significant step. One of our seminary professors once said, "Some places in Europe are so post-Christian that they are pre-Christian." Our ministry landscape is not far from this reality, so we will be in true pioneering mode, making the gospel understandable to those perhaps hearing it for the first time.

We are encouraged to live a few minutes' walk from the Polytechnic University, where we plan to start campus outreach, and most of the cafes in our neighborhood are packed with students. But tragedy struck just before Christmas as a disturbed student opened fire in a building at Charles University, killing 17 and injuring 25. The security response was massive, shutting down all transportation in the area, and our tram passed the blockaded bridge leading to the shooting just after the crisis ended. Myra has colleagues at Charles University, and they are thankfully safe.

Such tragedies are almost unheard of in the Czech Republic. Still, the aftermath reflects the pain of damaged humanity, where a neighboring war, human suffering, and the collapse of families cry out for a reason why and any path for healing. Jesus sees it all, and the gospel made the way to heal the nations (Rev. 22:2).



So, how do we reach these people? Part of Myra's doctoral research focuses on the mission of the church in post-Christian Czech society, and one of her articles was just published in a book. Our sponsoring pastor, Jakub Limr, was an example in her research, and we have started to work with him and his church, Mozaika, to gain a deeper understanding of reaching this culture, especially university students.
